About West Dean




West Dean College is a leading specialist institution dedicated to practice-based education in arts, crafts, conservation, and design. It forms part of West Dean, which, alongside West Dean Estate, is supported by the Edward James Foundation. Nestled in the stunning landscape of the South Downs National Park, and with a new site in Bloomsbury, London, the College provides an immersive and inspiring environment for students.

West Dean offers a distinctive and highly respected model of education. It delivers a wide range of programmes, from undergraduate and postgraduate degrees to residential short courses and continuing professional development (CPD). Students engage in hands-on, workshop-based learning across fine art, craft practices—including bookbinding, ceramics, clock-making, furniture, metalwork, and musical instrument making—interior and garden design, conservation, and creative writing. The College's small class sizes, expert tuition, and state-of-the-art studios ensure that students graduate with specialist skills, real-world experience, and strong industry connections.

The College is ambitious for growth and innovation. In recent years, student numbers have expanded, with over 215 higher education students currently enrolled in full- and part-time validated courses, alongside more than 6,000 students annually participating in its dynamic portfolio of short courses.

It fosters active research groups in areas such as conservation and tapestry while stewarding significant historic collections that document the legacy of its founder, Edward James. 
Additional Notes
